



**How to make
a paper
poppy for
Anzac Day**



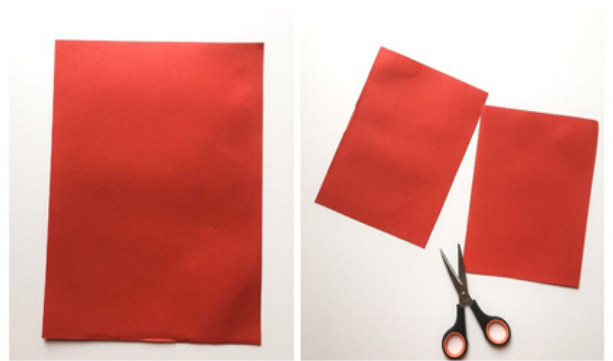
1.

Find (or make!) some red and black paper, a pair of scissors and a pipe cleaner.



2.

Take the red paper. Fold in half, then cut along the seam so you have two pieces.



3.

Then fold one of the smaller pieces in half, and then in half again.



4.

Using your scissors, hold onto a corner fold, and cut a loose love heart shape.



5.

Snip a tiny little bit off the end of that bottom corner.



6.

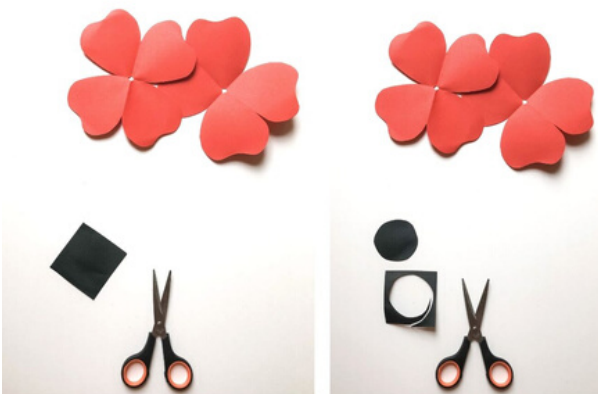
When you unfold the heart, you will see four petals and a little hole int the middle.

Then repeat with the other half of paper.



7.

Then take a small square of the black paper and cut a round circle.



8.

Fold the circle in half and make small little cuts all the way around the outside.

When it is still folded, cut a tiny little hole in the middle of the folded edge.



9.

You'll then have two sets of petals and a black centre, all with a little hole to thread your pipe cleaner stem through.



10.

Take the pipe cleaner and twist the end into a ball, before pushing it through your assembled flower pieces.



11.

Flip it over and make another twist at the back.



12.

And your poppies are done

You might like to send them as a card, place some on your letter box or make a bunch and turn them into a wreath
